

Student Success Librarian at Fairmont State University Library

The Student Success Librarian works with library colleagues, other campus student support units, academic departments, and students, to leverage and promote library resources contributing to student success.

Works to develop, implement, and assess information delivery tools and programs for the campus community;

Collaborates with academic partners to meet SOAR information literacy teaching and learning objectives;

Instructs at the group and individual level regarding general and assignment-specific library information and research resources to students, faculty, and staff;

Shares general and specialized research assistance to patrons in on-site, distance, and virtual settings;

Builds relationships with faculty, staff, and students through special events, innovative programming, and engagement activities;

Works one evening and rotates weekend hours;

Aids in the creation and maintenance of library instructional resources and materials, such as tutorials and LibGuides;

Provides effective marketing of services, resources, and spaces, in conjunction with University Relations and Marketing;

Conducts library tours and orientations;

Performs other assigned duties which contribute to the efficient and effective operation of the library and the university.

Minimum required education: ALA-Accredited Masters in Library & Information Science

Minimum required qualifications:

Two or more years of professional experience in an academic library setting

Commitment to user-oriented service philosophy

Knowledge of information literacy theory and practice

Up-to-date knowledge of First Year Experience trends and services

Experience with classroom teaching, training, or library instruction

Experience using technology to enhance teaching and learning

Experience using integrated library systems
